SHORT TERM GOALS:

- 2.5% energy usage reduction in the year to 31st March 2011 against the previous 12 months
- Register for Carbon Reduction Commitment (CRC) before end of September 2010
- Achieve the Carbon Trust Standard as a mark of our commitment to carbon reduction by 31 December 2010
- Deliver energy training and “Energy Champion” schemes to raise staff awareness on the importance of carbon reduction at NIA
- Targeted investment aimed at upgrading lighting systems across the site to more efficient technologies in order to reduce energy usage and carbon emissions.
- Develop a renewable energy strategy by 1st quarter of 2011
- Roll out energy KPIs to key areas of the business to encourage energy consumption reduction by 1 January 2011

LONG TERM GOAL:

- Newcastle International Airport aspires to reach carbon footprint levels by 2015 that are up to 15% below current levels
